Football

Manager duties include but are not limited to the following.

- Stat Keeping- stat forms will be provided. Managers will keep offensive and defensive stats during all games.
- <u>Water Stations</u>- during practices and games managers will keep water bottles full and readily available for players.
- <u>Med Kit</u>- the manager will be in charge of letting coaches know when supplies are needed in the
 med kit. The coaches will work with the manager before practices to refill any needed supplies.
- <u>Practice</u>- managers will be responsible for setting up drills during pre-practice which includes but are not limited to: setting up equipment, unlocking storage sheds, getting out footballs, etc.
- *Jerseys* managers are responsible for helping launder jerseys after games. Managers also have to organize, sort and hang/fold jerseys once they are clean. Managers aid in uniform check in and check out which might require some lifting. As a reward for dedicating their time and effort, football managers will be issued a hersey (just like what the players wear) for the season.
- Expectations- the managers are an important component to our team concept. The manager will be an extension of the coaches and facilitate administrative duties as listed above. The managers are as important to our team as our players and will be treated as a team member.
- Attendance- the expectation is for managers to be at ALL practices and games. When an absence does occur, athletic director and coaches must be notified ahead of time.
- <u>After Season</u>- Managers assist coaches in organizing storage rooms, accounting for all jerseys and balls, and storing equipment during off-season.
