The Board of Directors of Bandon School District No. 54, Coos County, Oregon, met in regular session on Monday, October 11, 2021 in the Bandon High School Library at 6:30 p.m. Due notice was published and a quorum was present.

Davis Hisel made a motion to approve the consent agenda. Greg Looney seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

**REPORTS/INFORMATION/DISCUSSIONS:**

District enrollment is 615.

Superintendent **Shauna Schmerer**, Director of Operations/Transportation **Chris Trevisiol** and Administrators **Melissa Radcliffe**, **Jordan Sammons**, **Becky Armistead** and **Courtney Wehner** provided written reports on what is happening in their respective schools or departments, copies of which are attached and made a part of the minutes. SIA, ESSER and Division 22 Assurances were discussed as follows:

**SIA (Student Investment Account) Plan:** Presenting to the public (for any input) on our quarterly review and annual report from 20-21 of our programs and expenses under SIA. 21-22 school year BSD was allocated \$552, 909.37. The District would like to pay for all PE teachers at each level (HS, MS and Elementary) to promote activity at all learning levels, 5 educational assistants throughout the district to help reduce class sizes by adults in classrooms for support and also for reset stations with behavior intervention strategies, a academic advisor at BHS, an additional counselor, and nurse. Also as part of the SIA funding suggested to go towards community outreach activities and School Unity Inclusion Projects. Additional input is welcomed.

**ESSER (Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund):** Plan is being developed on how funds will be used. Reinforcement of connection, engagement and recovery are all necessary parts. Monies need to also be allocated for community outreach. Input is welcome. The Classified Bargaining unit would like additional stipend for unprecedented hardship and danger for working during a pandemic. The District does not see this as fitting into what the ESSER funds were intended for and requests like this are not supported by ODE.

ESSER Funds currently are proposed to pay for additional staffing, facility improvement (air flow and safety), regaining learning that was missed during the pandemic, wellness activities for staff and students, along with community connections. Input is welcomed.

**Division 22** The District is currently compliant in all areas recognized in the survey given to each district in the State of Oregon.

BHS Student Representative **Kenny McMillen** reported on Leadership activities and Homecoming.

Breanna Quattrocchi made a motion to approve paying the bills in the amount of \$656,338.03 and David Hisel seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

A.J. Kimball made a motion to approve Resolution No. 22. Greg Looney seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

David Hisel made a motion to approve the Band Trip. A.J. Kimball seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

#### **Public Input for items not on the Agenda**

Lynelle Kummelehne, Bandon, presented her opinions about various issues, including the mask mandate, and her unhappiness with how board meetings are physically set up.

Felicia McMillen, Bandon student, shared that she is not attending school in person due to the mask mandate.

Paula McMillen, Bandon parent, shared her views regarding the mask mandate and the problems with student use of social media.

Dean Kummelehne, Bandon, shared his opinion regarding how much he pays in taxes to support the school district, and his unhappiness with the school system and in particular the district's policy on Public Comment at School Board Meetings.



### Professional Development:

- Character Strong continues to be our annual focus for professional development, with time also allotted for review and update of our ALICE safety protocols. We reviewed the ALICE expectations (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) via a presentation from Mrs. Radcliffe at the 9/22 early release PD time and will finish up with ALICE Scenarios training on 10/8.
- ALICE training for staff occurred in September and will continue on October 8. I am so grateful for Mrs. Radcliffe, who has taken point as a trained ALICE trainer!

### Special Education Update:

- Per ODE expectations, Bandon School District special education case managers have reached out via letter to all families with students on Individual Education Plans (IEPs) to offer the opportunity to meet regarding Individualized COVID-19 Recovery Services. Individualized COVID-19 Recovery Services are intended to help mitigate the interrupted/unfinished learning due to the pandemic impact on services in the previous 2 school years and to allow families an opportunity prior to a regularly scheduled IEP meeting to devise a plan. BSD case managers have been closely monitoring student progress and adjusting our plans accordingly since our return to in-person schooling last year, meaning that students are already receiving the "platinum package" of specially designed instruction.

### New Benchmark Screening for Reading and Math at HLMS:

- In looking at the Reading and Math data from our Fall Benchmark screening, it is clear that the impact of pandemic schooling is a reality for many students at HLMS. Using the STAR Screening Report, we can see students categorized into 4 groups: **At/Above Benchmark, On Watch, Intervention, Urgent Intervention**. All teachers were given reading and math data for the students on their rosters and we will be focusing attention on how we can adapt our current instructional plans to address the unfinished learning that is demonstrated in some of their assessment results.

### HLMS Building Needs:

- Continued support in reparation of minor damages to the building due to student behavior - consequences are being imposed including restorative practices.
- Continued bond work on HVAC and Gym;
- Expanded playground options (some are in process, others are in visionary development)
- New intercom/bell system that will accommodate our current needs (multiple schedules, clarity in communication in event of emergency, etc);
- Possibly wishful thinking, but a new key system that would allow for more consistent access and sure knowledge that we don't have keys out in the world? All of the outside access to our classrooms has me thinking safety - especially as we review our ALICE protocols!
- More to come, I am sure...I am still learning the quirks and needs of this building!
