A human trafficking assembly scheduled for May 12, 2022 &PM in our Gym for the community. Early in the day assembly for our HS and MS students.


Our administration team decided to go with NWEA. NWEA is a research-based adaptive assessment for our students K-12. NWEA is a not-for-profit leader in advancing student growth. K-12 staff will have professional development to be able to dig deep into how we can help our students grow within the world of learning. We currently do not have a K-12 system.

We will not be adopting any new curriculum this year. Next year we will be looking at a Math adoption K-12.

Summer learning will be offered for students K-12 (K-8 will depend on the interest of adults wanting to offer enrichment courses). We are getting a little over \$100,000. The district will need to put in roughly \$25,000 to get the little over \$100,000. Administration has been working on a plan and getting a brochure out to parents ASAP. Daycare is not an area the State is paying for this year, The State also is not giving nearly ½ of what they gave last year.
